



Covid-19 guidelines on our Coach Tours

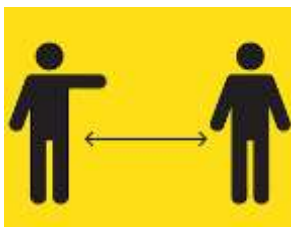
The health and safety of all our customers and drivers is our primary concern and priority. We are monitoring the information from the World Health Organisation (WHO) and are closely following the advice provided by the Government and HSE to ensure a safe environment and to avoid any unnecessary worry.

- We will have larger spacious vehicles and reduce capacity numbers, for the comfort and safety of all passengers and drivers.
- We have hand sanitizer and bins on board the vehicles.
- Please wash your hands before leaving home, and whenever there is a comfort stop.
- Hand washing and social distancing still remain the most important factors for everybody.
- Personal hygiene and hygiene etiquette are the key to minimising the spread of Covid-19 and drivers will communicate this to our guests.
- Drivers will be requested to take additional care when cleaning coaches and to sanitise regularly throughout the day.
- All travelling guests should also take responsibility themselves. Equip themselves with their own sanitizers and bring their own masks/face coverings. Use tissues when coughing or sneezing (and dispose of same safely afterwards), and to be mindful of those around them.
- Regular comfort stops to allow passengers to get fresh air.
- Vehicles will be rigorously deep cleaned at our depot before each tour, and air conditioning units will be regularly checked, cleaned and sanitized.

If you have a fever and/or cough or any of the other symptoms of Covid-19, you should stay at home, please.

Measures we advise our passengers to take:



Distance

Please maintain distance from Driver and Other passengers when boarding and disembarking the vehicle.



Seat Allocation and Selection

In line with Social Distancing, **the first row of seat(s) behind the driver will be kept vacant.**

Please select a seat away from others.

Passengers from the same household/family unit can, of course, sit together.



Coughing Etiquette

Observe and maintain good hygiene etiquette and be mindful of other passengers around you.

Equip yourself with your own sanitizers and masks.

Use tissues when coughing or sneezing (and dispose of same safely afterwards)



Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean

Masks/Face Coverings

Passengers on public transport must wear a mask/face covering when on the vehicle.

Masks/face coverings must also be worn in shops, shopping centres and some other indoor settings such as banks etc.

It is recommended that people also wear face masks/face coverings when social distancing is not always possible.

Please bring and wear your own mask/face covering.



Update from Mizen Head Visitor Centre

- All Guests must wear a mask for entry to Mizen Head Centre and must bring their **own** masks.
- Gloves must be worn in the gift shop and will be available at the door.
- People will be asked to sanitise their hands on entry to the centre.
- Cafe is open for takeout only and picnic tables outside for guest's use.
- Toilets are open for use.
